

"I can't just walk away," she thought...


The sky darkened and the moon peeped out behind the clouds, shining brightly like a gigantic beam.

Luan had done it, she had defeated Beetlejuice! Pride flowed within her like a fast-flowing river, knowing that everyone was safe.


As she rushed back home her Mum and Dad greeted her.
